

Pentecostal Campus Ministries Chaplain

Part-Time or Full-Time option

The purpose of Pentecostal Campus Ministries (PCM) is to promote the spiritual life of students, staff, and faculty of the University of Alberta by providing opportunities for community, discipleship and missional reach.

PCM shall be carried on without purpose of gain for its members, and any profits or other gains to the organization shall be used in promoting its objectives.

PCM is an outreach of the PAOC Alberta/Northwest Territories District. PCM is under direct supervision of the Campus Ministry Board of Directors. The Board is in turn, directly responsible to the District Leadership Team of the PAOC Alberta / Northwest Territories District.

In the last couple of years, PCM has created inroads on campus through partnerships with existing campus ministries and St. Joseph's College, namely through facilitating the Alpha Course. In addition, PCM has been instrumental in promoting campus-wide Christian unity through joint worship services and prayer gatherings. Red Frogs is an organization that PCM has helped facilitate in the past and would be worthwhile restarting in the future to meet tangible and practical needs for students on campus.

A. Responsibility

The Campus Chaplain(s) shall report directly to the PCM Board through regularly scheduled Board meetings. Minutes of the Board meetings will also be made available to the District Leadership Team by copies sent to the District Administrator.

B. Duties

1. The Campus Chaplain shall seek to promote the spiritual life of university students, staff, and faculty by providing opportunities for worship, fellowship, discipleship, pastoral guidance, missional witness, and local church involvement. Other activities will be developed in consultation with the Board.
2. The Campus Chaplain shall coordinate efforts to create and direct a PCM student group and see that its activities comply with the Constitution and Bylaws of the University of Alberta Students' Union. This compliance is specified in Bylaw 5600 known as "Student Groups."
3. The Campus Chaplain shall raise awareness and support (financial and human resources) for campus ministries and initiatives.

C. Qualifications

1. Hold valid and current credentials with the PAOC.
2. Hold an undergraduate degree from a university or an equivalent from an institution of higher learning. A Master's degree is recommended. Candidates for this role must be curious and intelligent.
3. Be strongly committed to PCM and have a sensitivity to the needs of university students.
4. Relate to campus chaplains, staff and students in a manner that is outgoing, warm and personable.
5. Approach campus ministry with an entrepreneurial mindset. Candidate(s) must take initiative and be organized.
6. Treat the University of Alberta campus as a mission field and place a high priority on being missional.
